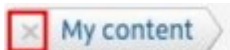



# 2.1. Before Creating a Research Output

First, you always need to **check if the content already exists in PURE**:

1. Remove the my content filter by on the “x”



2. Now you have access to every publication not just those related to your profile:
